THE Apostle Paul wrote his epistle to the Colossians shortly after being imprisoned in Rome around AD 62. News had come to him that certain false teachers were attempting to deceive the Colossians and lure them away from the Gospel they had originally received. He wrote this epistle at the same time he wrote to the Ephesians. As with all of his epistles, he commences with doctrine, then concludes with its application.
